The Parish of Capel & Ockley

Sunday 22nd March 2020 Lent 4 MOTHERING SUNDAY *Welcome to your church*





In our readings for today we first read from the book of Exodus which tells us the story of how a Hebrew baby was placed in a specially prepared papyrus basket and placed among the reeds on the river bank deliberately placed so that he would be rescued by the Egyptians. Discovered by Pharoah's daughter she named him Moses. A story of a mother's sacrifice to save her child. There is an alternate reading from the Old Testament as well because it is Mothering Sunday. From the Book of Samuel it tells of Hannah giving her son Samuel into the Lord's service in the Temple. Another sacrifice. Our second readings, again a choice, gives us more of Paul's letters, firstly his second letter to the Corinthians who speaks of God as loving parent who is a God of all consolation, who consoles us in our afflictions so that we may console others in just the same way. In Paul's letter to the church at Colossiae we are called to clothe ourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience. Forgive one another and most importantly Paul tells us to clothe ourselves with love which is the thing that binds everything together. How true. Then in our Gospel for today we have a very short reading from Luke retelling what happened when Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple to be presented as was the custom of the day. We celebrate this at the end of January at Candlemas when we have traditionally held our Christingle service. Wonderful things are said to his parents about the infant Jesus but already tinged with sadness the prophet predicts that metaphorically a sword will pierce Mary's soul. At this time it feels as if a sword has pierced our world..) Here will be the ultimate sacrifice as Mary will lose her son. An alternative gospel text for today can be this poignant text from John's gospel; the ultimate sacrifice itself, as Jesus dying on the cross gives his mother to his best friend and his best friend to his mother. Jesus dies for us all - the ultimate sacrifice for the sin of the whole world but an act which shows just how much God loves the world that he gave us his only son. Plenty here to think about on this Mothering Sunday and in the week ahead. We know that parents make many sacrifices for their children in often difficult circumstances. We will be reminded of our own mothers today and indeed anyone who was a mothering influence in our lives. I know I have more than one! Thanks be for mothers and mothering.
