Service of Dedication for the new Memorial Window

A service of dedication was held yesterday at St Margaret’s to give thanksgiving for this beautiful window created and given in memory of Charles and Patience Lee Steere and John and Joan Prideaux. The design is modern in vibrant colours featuring a dominant cross through which light streams through, a dove symbolising the Holy Spirit, with a backdrop of a pastoral view with a miniature Leith Hill tower at the top of the hill. The biblical quotation “I am the Resurrection and the Life” stands alongside the light of the cross. Created by Amanda Blair of Abinger Stained Glass and installed by John Mahoney of Horsham. 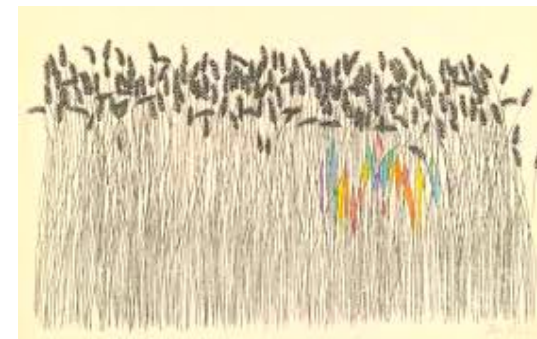
