We pray for those who have died and those who mourn; that they may find comfort in the promise of new life in Christ. We remember before you Stephen Burrridge and Philomena Bunce who died very recently, praying for their families and friends. We pray too for those facing painful anniversaries at this time.

Holy God, light to the nations, hear our prayers and draw each of us and all in creation into the glory of your eternal presence.
